

CHESTER COUNTY LIBRARY HOTSPOT AGREEMENT

The Borrower is a registered library patron 18 years or older with no fines or fees on his/her account or household account.

Only one hotspot per household may be borrowed. Patrons **must** have a valid phone number to check out a hotspot. The hotspot may be checked out for one week—there are no renewals.

The fee for overdue hotspots is \$5.00 per day for every day the device is not returned. Cords to the devices must also be returned or fines will be assessed. **THESE DEVICES CANNOT BE PUT IN THE DROP BOX AND THEY MUST BE RETURNED IN THE BOX THEY WERE CHECKED OUT IN. IF ALL ITEMS ARE NOT RETURNED (CHARGER BOX, CHARGER CABLE, AND HOTSPOT DEVICE) THE HOTSPOT WILL NOT BE CHECKED IN AND FINES WILL ACCUMULATE.**

Hotspots are deactivated in three days if they are not returned to the library and the fines will be added to the patron's account.

There is a \$100.00 replacement cost if the hotspot is damaged or not returned. The hotspot **MUST** be in working condition when it is returned or the cost will be added to the patron's account. Staff members check every hotspot upon each return.

The Borrower understands that these devices have no filters if children are using them.

The Borrower has read and agreed to the attached Chester County Library policy about internet use especially in regard to pirating, illegal downloads, viewing child pornography, etc.

HOTSPOTS ARE PURCHASED BY THE CHESTER COUNTY LIBRARY TO PROVIDE THE BORROWER WITH AN INTERNET CONNECTION.

ACCEPTABLE USE OF THIS DEVICE:

Respect for privacy of others
Compliance with copyright laws and licenses for individual data and programs
Consideration for the security and functioning of the hotspot device

UNACCEPTABLE USE OF THIS DEVICE:

Uses for any purposes that violate applicable federal, state, or local laws including
copyright laws
Interfering with or disrupting the hotspot device
Attempting to gain or gaining unauthorized entry to other computing information or
communications sources or devices (hacking)
Malicious, threatening, harassing, or obscene behavior or language
Misrepresentation of oneself
Activities that could cause congestion and disruption of networks and systems
